CYPRUS RALLY

Voice on 'phone – "Do you want to do a rally?"

Me - "Yes - when?"

Voice on 'phone – "End of September"

Me - "Where?"

Voice on 'phone - "Cyprus"

That is how it started. Dave Howell had mistimed his nuptials and arranged a birth for approximately when he should have been in Cyprus with Geoff Warkup in his Lada.

We had a brief meeting at Bridlington before Geoff set off with Paul (Service Crew) to tow the car on a trailer to Pireus, just South of Athens. Phil (Service Crew) flew out on the Saturday before the event and I flew out on the Tuesday.

John Taylor, Phil Short and two M.C.D. men were on the same flight, which was delated one hour at Heathrow (needed a new wick!).

Landing at Larnace the heat met you as you left the plane and the Immigration threw a wobbly when I said I didn't know where I was staying.

Paul met me and by the time we had reached Nicosia it was dark. We went and signed on at the A.A. (Rally Headquarters) then had an Italian meal before retiring to the bar for a few beers.

Wednesday morning dawned too early and we were at the FINA office for 8 am to arrange petrol supplies. After a call at the volunteered to help. This meeting

LADA Importer to see the Service Crew and rally car we set off to do a small recce. Our recce car was a 1971 Moskrich supplied F.O.C.

We went straight to the first stage using road book and then transferred to Terry Harrayman's pace notes. They were also kindly supplied F.O.C. and appeared at Mosky pace to be perfect.

The car boiled three times during the first two stages and on the third the exhaust fell off. It took us all day to do four stages but by dark we had at least an idea of the conditions we were to encounter.

That night it was a Chinese meal and a few beers before retiring early.

Thursday morning also dawned early and hot, in fact it reached 100 degrees that day. We had to conclude our negotiations with FINA before scrutineering, which was held in the Mercedes garage. It was organised, as was everything else on the rally, with smooth efficiency and the only fault was lack of rear mud-flaps, which we fitted later.

The afternoon was spent working out a service schedule and this proved difficult as I didn't know the area at all. We rounded off the day with a radio interview for Humberside, a meal in the hotel and early to bed.

Friday morning I had arranged to see Stelios, who was the Service Manager for the LADA Importers, about servicing as he Continued on Page 13 ...

turned my service schedule upside down as he wanted everything differently.

Little did I know that he was a Cypriot copy of our own beloved T. Lucas – e.g. arms and legs everywhere and a lot of talk as well. We were to share service with a Group 1 Lada driven by a local and they were to provide a guide for our Service Crew.

Friday afternoon all the Service Crews met and our car was put in Parc Ferme, ready for the start. We were No. 32 - 25th off so at 2 minute intervals we left at 6.48 pm just as darkness fell. It was a well known fact that the first section was the toughest and if you could get to Pathos after 12 stages you would not have too much trouble afterwards.

These 12 stages were one long rush (reasons later) and the impression was that there were no straights, just a succession of corners. Incidents of note during the night were a puncture on one stage and with all the corners we had to change on stage – 3 minutes lost.

Later the lights began to dim – evidently the electrics can cope with heads and 4 spots for stages but not road sections as well, so we changed a battery and drove on heads only for a time.

Service points came up on schedule and our T. Lucas cut out appeared at other points as well. One stage was 18.5 miles and I managed the notes right through it

but when we came to a 22 miler followed immediately by a 25 miler I was defeated and had to revert to the road book.

None of the junctions were arrowed so you had to be on the ball with your intervals we had one wrong slot, which lost us about 5 minutes.

We reached Pathos just as dawn was breaking and had a twenty minute service before clocking in for a shower and breakfast, with car in Parc Ferme.

I immediately checked the results so far and soon found out why we had been so rushed. I had mistaken the Regs. And had

been clocking in 3 minutes early at arrival controls. This doubled up and adding our time for the battery change had given us 77 mins. Penalties on the road. We were down in 27th position but decided to carry on because even with these penalties we still had a chance of a decent result.

We now had 4 service crew as the other Lada had fallen out so we knew service would be no problem.

The next section was nine stages, starting at about 10 am and finishing at 7 pm at Cape Kiti, near Larnaca. This was the section we were dreading because of the heat but, as things turned out, we were lucky and there was a haze most of the day which took the sting out of the sun.

These nine stages went well with us catching two cars on the first stage then starting six stages behind first a Beetle

then a Toyota, who pulled over immediately we caught them. We were drinking a large bottle of water every two stages and with other drinks at halts, plus those given to us at stage starts, we averaged 0.75 pints of liquid per stage each.

Nothing unusual happened over these stages, we just got coated in dust and soaked in sweat, except on the last stage we overtook 3 cars and one motorbike on the stage itself – no marshals between start and finish so the public left their spectator points early.

1 am Sunday saw us off again in 23rd position and the dust gave us a difficult time overtaking cars until the running order got sorted out. We only had five stages in the dark, the other six in daylight – hot again. Geoff got stuck into these and we slowly crept upwards, places were gained, partly by retirement and partly by stubborn concentration.

Service went well and when the O/S/R shocker broke, we were lucky to have our

own crew at the next service and they changed it in just under8 minutes.

By the time our last break came at Limassol we had crept up to 15th overall. Geoff had 1.5 hours sleep whilst I checked results, showered and ate.

The last four stages were not a sting in the tail, just a way to get us back to Nicosia. The first was all tarmac – done on worn chunkies, and the others were good open stages.

We got into the Stadium at Nicosia at 6 pm after two days' rallying, in 14th place. Subtracting my error would have improved our position to 13th, but better surfaces and less dust were incalculable so an approximation was 10th or 11th.

So after driving my first idea of the route it became clear that with the start and finish being in Bridlington this would limit

how far south into Holderness it could go and the final format was put together.

After meeting the Bridlington organisers -Alec Poole and Andrew Warner, with the assistance of David James, a plan was agreed for the start and finish at the Spa.

Some changes to the parking arrangements and road works in Brid caused my good friend and clerical guru Gavin Heseltine (pens are your friends!) headaches and changes to the road book which he compiled, printed and bound himself.

However other than the weather and the Spa being invaded by aliens and zombies things seemed to work out OK.

Firstly a couple of apologies.

Due to a last minute change to the parking arrangements at the Spa the first and last tulips in the road-book did not match the route on the day. This was the third change in the last two weeks and a result of a mix up between the Council and the Spa as to when the Carousel Fairground ride would have vacated the area between the Spa and the Lifeboat Station.

We intended to issue a verbal instruction to each crew as you started and this is the second apology as we "allowed" a number of you to start en-masse without

speaking to John Dixon who was starting you off.

We had a number of crews participating for the first time who had never seen a "tulip diagram" before and I am pleased to say they all found their way around, not necessarily always on the correct route but as one of them said they got better the further they went. Lets hope they do more events as newcomers are always most welcome.

Also a couple of late changes of vehicle due to weather forecast and a mechanical issue.

The only letter-board everyone got in the correct location was the last one (LHR/76) and we gave you it's location.

The letter-board most crews missed (4) was GB/29 which was also the one with

the most incorrect locations recorded (7). I suspect this indicates that more people missed it but guessed the location having worked out what the letter-board might be from the "pairs" having seen LHR/76.

Most controversy was over letter-board BRN/72 (War memorial at Lissett). Of those correctly recording the letter-board (16), nine had the correct location as 72 with 7 recording the location as 71.

Seven crews scored 100% on pairing the letter-boards which were the **International Vehicle** Registration Codes and the IATA Airport Code for the main airport at those countries capital city. Four all had difficulties matching D (Germany) with

TXL as Berlin's major airport, with most guessing at BRN (Berne) which matches with CH (Switzerland). Seven crews

scored zero having not made the connection, probably not helped by missing a number of letter-boards. One crew cleverly made a match despite only getting one of the pair, having got LHR they assumed GB.

Unluckiest crews were John & Sue Wylie who had 100% on the letter-boards and

> locations but missmatched two of the pairs dropping four points and Simon & Fiona Nutter who also avoided the controversial BRN/72 issue, correctly matched all the pairs but then dropped two points in recording the location for letter-board GB as 19 instead of 29, was this a slip of the pen or a guess having missed the board but correctly worked out what it was likely to have been? Both crew had a near miss to a share of

the win.

Congratulations to the winners, Alan & Sue Gilbert (Car 7) Vauxhall Viva HC, who in equestrian terms achieved a "clear round". The well travelled pair confirmed they had not been to all the airports as when they went to Cuba they flew into one of the smaller airports!

Less successful were Rob Rook/ Mark Casey who were OTL at half-way following a wrong slot on a road section.

A 10 second improvement would have seen them lying 3rd and 21st respectively. What turned out to be the final completed stage (Stage 2) scored a maximum for Luke/ Rob dropping them to 64th whilst **Rob & John Brook** moved up to 27th. Commiserations to the Organisers on a disappointing return for all their efforts.

Rainworth Skoda Stages Rally - A disappointing day for both our crews. Ken Sturdy/Richard Wood (Suzuki Swift Maxi) discovered how effective gravel traps are on Stage 1 and also spent Stage 2 stuck until rescue arrived. Two maximum times saw them in joint last place (75th). A steady Stage 3 followed by four quick stages (22, 20, 19 & 19 fastest) saw them recover to 57th o/a at the finish. **Stephen Radcliffe/Pete Gunson** (Porsche 911) had a decent morning after a slow start (37, 19, 29 & 25 fastest) put them in 26th overall before retirement, reason unknown.

Pendragon Stages Rally - Event regulars (well they all did it last year!) Dave Jackson/Guy Gladwin (Ford Ka) and Ian & David James (Nissan Micra) both suffered a stop/start rally caused by others accidents and red-flags (yes that's right now red again rather than yellow). Dave/Guy got confused on Stage 1 (too much talking!) between a Merge and a Split (not helped by approaching it backwards apparently), the resulting

loss of bearings saw an early cut to the finish and a maximum. Being red flagged on Stages 3 & 8 and with Stage 4 cancelled for all the field they only got four competitive stages and finished 53rd o/a. Ian & David also got caught up in the red flag/cancellation of Stages 3 & 4 but had a clear run otherwise. A few scary moments on the wet stages were reported but they survived to finish 57th o/a.

Woodpecker Stages - Ian Bainbridge/ Daniel May (Subaru Impreza) had a strong top ten finish and were running 7th o/a for three of the last four stages before slipping back to 9th o/a on the last stage. Allan McDowall/Gavin Heseltine (Ford Escort) broke a half-shaft in Stage 3 and despite making it out of the stage and the 20+ miles back to service retired when going OTL before a repair could be made.

Galloway Hills Stages Rally - It was a long trek to Castle Douglas for Rob Rook/ Steve Varey (Ford Escort MkI) but ultimately a successful one. After five of Galloway & Dumfries's finest stages a creditable 47th o/a and 5th in the historic class was the reward. Incidentally the historic class included all Categories including BDA's and a 4WD Mitsubishi Gallant. Less fortunate were Paul Rawson/Graham Wild (Ford Escort MkI) who were off the road and into retirement on Stage 2 whilst lying 54th o/a.

Trackrod Historic Cup & Trackrod Forest Stages - With a total of ten crews having some NHMC influence on these events a separate report is elsewhere in the magazine.


