

Steady overnight rain meant the stages were very wet and these conditions would

persist all day.

Next came Car 3, Stephen/Jack Tilburn (Ford Escort Mk2) a further 2 secs back and 1 sec ahead of Car 6, Barry Morris/Tom Hutchings (Darrian T90 GTR+). Three crews tied for sixth, 5 secs further back, the first of the 4WD's Car 10 Lee/ Abigail Allen (Mitsubishi Evo III), Car 15 Allan McDowall/James Robson (Opel Kadett) and Car 18 Michael Walton/Jamie Vaughan (Ford Escort

fastest to maintain 4th overall. (2) Davey slipped to fourth fastest on the stage and lost the lead dropping to 2nd overall. (97) Corner moved up to 7th overall with fifth quickest on stage just behind (18) Walton and (15) McDowall who were 6th and 7th= on stage times. Matching Car (15) on stage were (7) Mike English/Andy Robinson (Ford Escort MkII) to move up to 9th overall with the top 10 completed by (11) Rob Cox/Joe Graham (Ford Escort) with 9th equal fastest the same as (10) Allen who slipped to 8th overall.

SS6 and the top three repeated the previous stage with 6 seconds separating them. (8) Walton set fourth quickest to move up to 4th O/A with (7) English 5th quickest to stay 5th O/A. (16) Murro secured 6th quickest moving up two places to 7th O/A. (15) McDowall slowed to 7th quickest dropping to 5th O/A. (19) Cathy

(14) Ashley Davies/Sam Fordham (Peugeot 205) had ninth quickest to sit just outside the top 10. Holding on to 8th O/A and 9th O/A were (11) Cox and 10 (Allen) despite times outside the ten quickest on stage.

With SS7 & 8 being in the dark a different challenge lay ahead.

Extending his overall lead by 15 seconds (1) Woodhouse beat (97) Corner into second quickest by 11 seconds, with (5) Taylor a further 4 seconds back with third quickest and (18) Walton another 5 seconds in arrears in fourth quickest. These four maintained the top places overall of Woodhouse, Taylor, Corner and Walton. Fifth guickest by a further second moved (19) Sewart to 9th O/A and sixth quickest allowed (9) Gary Mason/ John Matthews (Ford Escort MkII) to make their first show in the top 10 quickest. Consolidating 5th O/A was (15) McDowall with seventh quickest. Joint eighth quickest (7) English in 6th O/A and (33)

Stuart Popplewell/Nigel Barber (Seat Ibiza) lying just outside the top 10 O/A. Tenth quickest was (12) Andy Graham/Sean Bailey (Ford Escort MkII).

The final stage SS8 saw a repeat with the top four picking up the quickest times in the same order as SS7 and maintaining their overall positions. (1) Woodhouse posting his fifth fastest stage time of the six that were completed. Fifth fastest securing 7th O/A was (11) Cox followed home by (15) McDowall with sixth fastest and 5th O/A. Seventh fastest was (19) Sewart holding onto 9th O/A with (33) Popplewell in 8th quickest to secure 10th O/A. Ninth quickest was (14) Davies who slipped out of the top 10 to 11th O/A. tenth quickest was shared between three crews with (16) Murro claiming 8th O/A.

The first section of the Rally was straightforward map references. As Lund was blackspotted the only way to string the controls together without retracing was to make a detour from the obvious route to PC1. The MRs continued through Kilnwick along the whites round Cawkeld and up to Kirkburn and TC3 (Graham Gough hidden behind a load of ERCC gravel chips). Some time lost on this section and we never did find PC7.

From Kirkburn the route followed the main road towards Driffield turning along the whites through Little Driffield. The second of these two sections made me doubt the organisers definition of "good surfaced road" and the wife thought we had run into a quarry! At the end of this section we found Tony Carmichael trying to douse a fire after the bottom had dropped out of his battery.

In common with everybody else we missed PC9, sailing straight past Don hidden in a lane normally reserved for the "back seat brigade". From here we followed route card 1. Having got lost on Cottam Airfield (I don't know whether we should have been there or not!) we went to TC6. Having decided where to start and which way to go on the circular strip route the remainder of the rally was straightforward, although we had to cut out one section to finish in time.

This is the second minirally we have done and although we have not done very well (at least we finished this one) we have enjoyed them both immensely and

PokerStars Rally 8th/9th November 2019 Allan McDowall/Gavin Heseltine Opel Kadett, Class D, Car No 26

Allan and I had always avoided this event as we perceived the weather was a bit dodgy with fog, rain, ice and snow common - but following our disappointing

run on the Mull Rally we decided to enter.

Our fears were confirmed when a phone call on the Tuesday before the rally from Isle of Man Events warned us that that tomorrow afternoons ferry was likely to be cancelled because of adverse weather. We (Allan and I) were on the early morning (0215) sailing so ours was ok but the service crew would be

affected and ended up being delayed for 12 hours, arriving at 0600 Friday morning.

Recce was scheduled for Thursday 0900-2100 and Friday 0900-1500. The route for Friday night was in the SW of the island and was made up of one Stage run twice back to back and two others run once each with a twenty-minute Service at the TT Grandstand before running each of the three once more each.

After a couple of hours recceing we decided to give-up as the amount of water standing on the stages (and in places running down them) made multiple passes futile.

We relocated to the central area and the three stages (each to be run three times) to be used on Saturday. A single pass again over these stages confirmed the areas most affected by standing water and as these stages were known to us from previous Manx National rallies we adjourned to our digs for some sleep.

Going back out after dark and we had a couple of runs over the first three stages that would be used in the dark on Friday night. The rain had stopped and most of the standing/running water had gone. We felt more confident after this dark session.

Friday morning and the team were now all together so after breakfast we put the car through Scrutin-

eering and completed Documentation.

A final trip (twice) around the three Saturday stages with one of the Service Crew along for the ride – it was his first visit to the Isle of Man. A chance encounter with Arron Newby/Rob Fagg whilst we were both refuelling recce cars at Kirk Michael garage gleaned some info re dodgy areas for standing water – cheers Rob. Drivers briefing at 1530 and then back to the digs to eat and chill until our start time of 1846.

By the start came round the weather had cleared up the rain had been stopped for several hours although the side roads

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... continued from Page 10 were still damp. Along with most of the field we chose full wets.

SS1 Keristal 1 (3.87 miles)

A steady run that nearly came to grief on the last corner of the stage, a downhill tightening left, as the car half spun with no warning and we just missed the wall on the outside of the bend.

3Min 51Sec 14th quickest and 3rd in Class, fastest on 3.20 was Car 1. Jamie Jukes/ James Morgan Mitsubishi Mirage R5.

SS2 Keristal 2 (3.87 miles)

Second run cancelled following a big accident, Car 27 went of on the last corner and hit the wall!

SS3 Ronague 1 (7.57 miles)

Warned at the start to be aware of "blackice" on a couple of

sections within the stage. No problems with standing-water but the stage was generally very slippery. Caught Car 25 with almost two miles to go and despite being on his bumper he never took any opportunity to let us by. We estimate it cost us 20+ seconds and almost caused us to go off! The marshal at the stop line was not impressed with Allan's attempts to draw the issue to Car 25's attention! 7Min 58Sec 12th quickest and 3rd in Class, fastest on 6.51 was Car 2. Arron Newby/Rob Fagg Subaru Impreza.

SS4 Back of the Moon 1 (8.90 miles)

We started in front of Car 25 who informed Allan whilst in the gueue that he had been off on SS3 and was just trying to get to the finish – how was this meant to excuse his actions! Advised at the start that due to extensive "black-ice" the stage had been shortened by approx. 4 miles and would now Stop at Post 10. We took this one a bit steady as I probably over did the "black-ice" warnings although we were flagged down at a couple of places displaying warning triangles but no sign of the related car.

> 4Min 43Sec 12th= quickest and 4th in 4.07 Newby/ Fagg Subaru Impreza.



Holding Control/

Advised that due to deteriorating conditions and extensive "black-ice" the rest of the Stages were

cancelled and we should report to MC3 for the re-start tomorrow. End Leg 1 (3 Stages 16.29 Miles) 12th O/A and 3rd in Class.

Leg 2 – Following re-seeding overnight we were running 13th on the road and as we left the TT Grandstand the rain had returned.

SS8 Druidale 1 (6.78 miles)

At the higher altitude the rain had turned to snow which although not settling was blowing across the road. Compared to the poor ATC/Start marshals you realise

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how fortunate you are in a relatively warm rally car whilst they are exposed to all the weather. The stage starts very fast for the run across to Brandywell Cottage before heading South down the narrow/bumpy Druidale. As we started the climb out of Druidale we were shown the red-flag and backed-off. A few corners further on Car 11 was off partially blocking the stage, the crew were out of the car showing the OK board and we were able to pass (as had the five cars between him and us) and so we continued to the end of the stage at a bit below full commitment.

We had a time recorded and waited to see what would happen – eventually the stage was cancelled for "incorrect deployment of red flag".

water collecting on the inside of some usually fast blind corners.

8Min 15Sec 16th quickest and 4th in Class, fastest on 7.34 was Car 12 Martyn Jones/Llion Williams Vauxhall Nova. After a twenty-minute service halt at the TT Grandstand and a quick check-over we are back out for a second run at the same three stages.

SS11 Druidale 2 (6.78 miles)

A repeat of the earlier stage with a similar outcome, about half a mile further than the off causing the bogus red-flag incident we join the back of a queue of stationery cars with others joining behind us. Car 8

has had a "tank-slapper" and is across the road with a broken/miss ing front wheel. The assembled crews manhandle the

car and are able to replace the wheel in a sufficient fashion to enable the damaged car to drive half mile to the end of the stage. We all followed in convoy with 15 of us getting a nominal time of 6.31. Three crews were ahead of the incident and got actual time. Fastest on 6.16 was Car 5 Steve Colley/Mark Rodman Mitsubishi Lancer Evo VII.

SS10 Baldwins 1 (7.89 miles)

Class, fastest on 5.01 Newby/ Fagg

SS9 Staarvey 1 (5.65 miles)

A little bit ragged on this one going wide

and partially on the grass but getting away

with it. 5Min 31Sec 18th guickest and 4th in

Very fast beginning to the stage across to Brandywell Cottage from the "other side" and then over the top and alongside the reservoir via the narrow lanes under the trees towards Douglas. Very tricky with

SS12 Staarvey 2 (5.65 miles)

Lost the power steering whilst waiting to start the stage. The rain was starting to affect the stages as puddles were now

more in evidence and one or two places had a film of standing water across the stage. 5Min 25Sec 13th quickest and 4th in Class, fastest on 5.02 Car 17 Mark Kelly/Neil Colman Ford Escort MkII.

SS13 Baldwins 2 (7.89 miles)

The last few miles after the reservoir which are normally very fast becoming more and more tricky as the "sunken" nature of the road is causing more issues with the depth of water being held on the road. A question of remembering/noting

from the previous run and anticipating thinks being worse! 8Min 23Sec 16th quickest and 4th in Class, fastest on 7.39 was Kelly/Colman Ford Escort.

Another twentyminute service at the

TT Grandstand, unable to sort the power steering issue (water in the electrics!) so back out for the final run.

SS14 Druidale 3 (6.78 miles)

After two abortive runs having done 85%+ of the stage each time would this be third time lucky! The last mile of the stage was carnage with cars from the previous run off everywhere (at least four in half a mile). Severe standing water near the finish meant we were pleased to get out of the stage. It was starting to feel like a matter of survival rather than pushing on. 7Min 04Sec 9th quickest and 4th in

Class, fastest on 6.25 was Kelly/Colman Ford Escort.

SS15 Staarvey 3 (5.65 miles)

Advised at the start that this was to be the last stage as the final run at SS16 Baldwins 3 was cancelled due to deteriorating conditions. From the finish we were to go via Tholt-y-will to MTC4 at the TT Grandstand.

A heavy shower during this stage and backing-off at the big jumps after a previous "near do". 5Min 38Sec 12th= quickest and 4th in Class, fastest on 5.13 was Kelly/Colman Ford Escort.

> Very happy to finish 10th O/A and 3rd in Class (Second in Class award as the Class winner Mark Kelly was 2nd O/A). It was a very challenging event but well worthwhile.

Thanks to locals/in-

NB The dedication of the organisers/ marshals and particularly time-keepers who stuck it out in such dreadful weather was remarkable. I heard that the last stage was cancelled at the request of the CMO as he was concerned that those out on the stages were in danger of getting hypothermia – a sensible decision we have no issues with.
